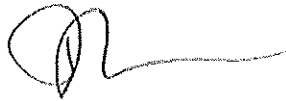

UNANIMOUS WRITTEN RESOLUTIONS OF THE DIRECTORS OF THE COMPANY

January 3, 2012

WHEREAS: The Directors of the Company consider that the Company is of doubtful solvency having regard to and having carefully reviewed and considered the unaudited financial statements of the Company as at 31 October 2011 and the cash flow position of the Company as at January 3, 2012;

AND WHEREAS: The Directors of the Company consider that it is in the best interests of the Company to take steps to stabilise the operations of the Company, to sell certain assets of the Company and to explore restructuring options for the Company including a plan of re-organisation with its creditors;

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Company (the "Board"), having carefully evaluated and considered such factors and information as it has deemed necessary or appropriate in order to reach a fully informed conclusion, has determined that it is advisable and in the best interest of the Company and its shareholders that the Company file a voluntary Chapter 11 Petition (the "Chapter 11 Petition") for relief under chapter 11 of the United States Bankruptcy Code, 11 U.S.C. §§ 101-1532 (the "Bankruptcy Code") and to seek ancillary relief in the Cayman Islands by filing a winding up petition and then seeking the appointment of joint provisional liquidators pursuant to section 104(3) of the Companies Law (2011) Revision (the "Cayman Proceedings");

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED:

1. **THAT** the Board should, and it hereby does, unanimously recommend to the sole shareholder of the Company that it authorize the Company to file the Chapter 11 Petition in the United States Bankruptcy Court for the District of Delaware (the "Bankruptcy Court") and the Cayman Proceedings in the Grand Court of the Cayman Islands (the "Cayman Court");
2. **THAT** any one director be authorized to take all steps necessary to solicit such written resolution from the sole shareholder;
3. **THAT** the law firm of DLA Piper LLP (US) and Maples and Calder shall be, and hereby is, employed as counsel for the Company under general retainer for the purpose of the Chapter 11 Petition and the Cayman Proceedings;
4. **THAT** David Teichmann and the other officers and directors of the Company (each an "Authorized Person," and together the "Authorized Persons") are hereby each severally authorized, directed and empowered, in the name of and on behalf of the Company, to execute, verify and cause to be filed the Chapter 11 Petition, including the schedules of assets and liabilities, the statement of financial affairs

and other ancillary documents required by the Bankruptcy Code and the Federal Rules of Bankruptcy Procedure to be filed with the Chapter 11 Petition;

5. **THAT** each Authorized Person is hereby severally authorized, directed and empowered, in the name of and on behalf of the Company, to execute, verify and cause to be filed requests for first-day relief from the Bankruptcy Court that such Authorized Person may deem necessary, proper, or desirable in connection with the Chapter 11 Petition, with a view to the successful prosecution thereunder;
6. **THAT** each Authorized Person is hereby severally authorized and directed, in the name and on behalf of the Company, with the advice and assistance of counsel, to prepare, execute, deliver and file all pleadings, submissions, affidavits, documents and information required to be filed with the Cayman Court for the purpose of the Cayman Proceedings and to respond to all requests, summons or orders by such Court for information or attendance at, and to be present at, or to cause counsel to be present at and to give undertakings in connection with, any hearing or proceeding of such Court, relating to the matters contemplated by the foregoing resolutions;
7. **THAT** any Authorized Person, is hereby severally authorized to instruct DLA Piper and/or Maples and Calder to do all things and/or give any advice that Authorized Person considers would assist the Company in advancing the Chapter 11 Petition or the Cayman Proceedings;
8. **THAT** each Authorized Person is hereby severally authorized, directed and empowered, in the name of and on behalf of the Company, (i) to take or cause to be taken any and all actions, to make or cause to be made all payments (including but not limited to payments of expenses, retainers and filing fees), (ii) to make or cause to be made all federal, state and local governmental, administrative and/or regulatory filings as may be required or advisable under the laws or regulations of any jurisdiction, and (iii) to negotiate, enter into, execute, deliver and perform all other documents, agreements, certificates or instruments as may be necessary, appropriate, convenient or proper, in each case to effectuate the intent of, and the transactions contemplated by, the foregoing resolutions, and the execution and delivery thereof by such Authorized Person to be conclusive evidence of such approval;

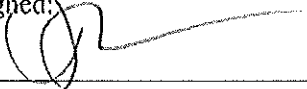

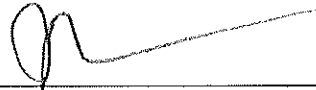

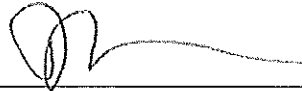
